SENATE RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE OFFICE OF THE ADMINISTRATIVE DIRECTOR OF THE COURTS OF THE HAWAII STATE JUDICIARY TO COLLECT, COMPILE, AND SHARE DATA ON THE ASSESSMENT OF FEES, COURT COSTS, FINES, AND RESTITUTION IN CASES AGAINST MINORS.

WHEREAS, research shows that charging fees, fines, costs, 1 and restitution to youth is harmful to young people and their 2 3 families; and 4 WHEREAS, in Hawaii, the consequences of such costs fall 5 disproportionately on Native Hawaiian, Pacific Islander, and 6 Black youth, who are more likely to be arrested, detained, and 7 unable to afford fees, fines, costs, and restitution; and 8 9 WHEREAS, although state law authorizes courts to charge 10 youth and their families a range of fees and fines, judges 11 across the State rarely impose such costs in practice; and 12 13 WHEREAS, research shows that fees and fines serve no public 14 safety function and may instead undermine public safety by 15 increasing the likelihood of youth recidivism; and 16 17 WHEREAS, because youth cannot afford to pay restitution, 18 crime survivors rarely see any compensation for harm they may 19 have experienced; and 20 21 WHEREAS, jurisdictions in the majority of states that 22 assess fees, costs, fines, and restitution to youth spend more 23 money trying to collect those outstanding debts than they 24 receive in revenue; and 25 26 WHEREAS, there is a growing consensus that fees and fines 27 should not be assessed for mistakes made in a person's youth, 28 29 regardless of the age or jurisdiction in which the person is adjudicated or sentenced; and 30 31

WHEREAS, several states throughout the country have 1 prohibited the imposition of fees and fines and limited the 2 3 impact of restitution on young people and their families; now, 4 therefore, 5 BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate of the Thirty-second 6 7 Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2023, 8 that the Office of the Administrative Director of the Courts of 9 the Hawaii State Judiciary is requested to collect, compile, and share data on the assessment of fees, court costs, fines, and 10 11 restitution in cases against minors; and 12 13 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that this data is requested to 14 include: 15 (1)The total and annual average amount of fees, court 16 costs, fines, and restitution that are assessed, 17 18 collected, waived, and outstanding in cases against minors for each of the last five years; and 19 20 21 (2) For the circuit, family, and district courts in each judicial district, a description of each fee, court 22 cost, or fine that can be assessed in cases against 23 minors, and their respective amounts; and 24 25 26 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Office of the Administrative Director of the Courts is requested to submit a 27 report of findings and recommendations to the Legislature no 28 later than twenty days prior to the convening of the Regular 29 Session of 2024; and 30 31 32 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this 33 Resolution be transmitted to the Chief Justice of the Hawaii 34 Supreme Court and Administrative Director of the Courts. 35 36 37
